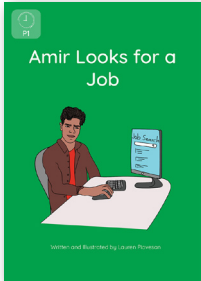


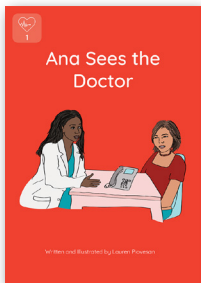
# Our Levelled Stories

ESL Reads cover a range of relatable topics for EAL students. Our collection includes 15 stories in 5 literacy levels; 75 titles.



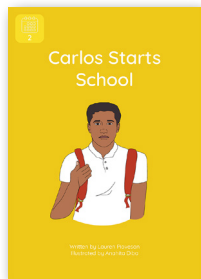
## Amir Looks for a Job

This story is about a young man who needs a job to help his family. The story describes the job-seeking process and introduces students to a range of relevant work-related vocabulary words.

This story is about a young adult who becomes stressed as a result of multiple life changes. This story teaches students about mental health, using interpreters, referrals and confidentiality in the health sector. This book contains some sensitive information.



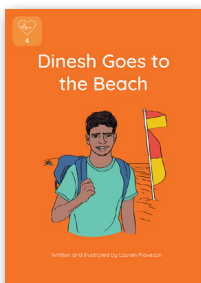
## Carlos Starts School

This is a humorous story about a young man navigating his first day of high school. This story is ideal for introducing students to school-related vocabulary and the structure of a school day.



## Chen and Lin Buy a Microwave

This story is about a couple who buy a microwave that is faulty. It teaches students about the process of returning a faulty product and encourages them to seek help from shop assistants.



## Dinesh Goes to the Beach

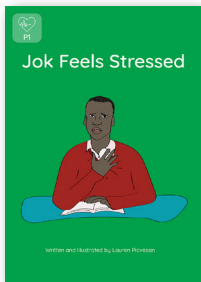
This story is about a young man's first trip to the beach. It teaches students about essential water safety concepts, such as reading safety signs and flags, seeking assistance at the beach, being sun smart and finding safe places to swim.

This story introduces students to the process and language required to meet up with a friend and order coffee. It helps learners navigate the challenges around speaking confidence when using a new language.



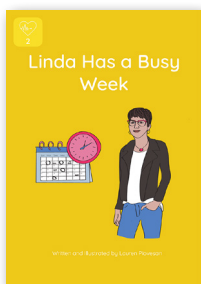
### Jok Feels Stressed

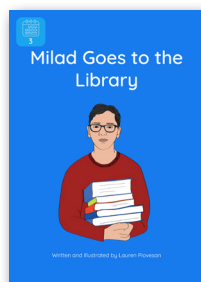
### Layla Wants a Job

### Linda Has a Busy Week

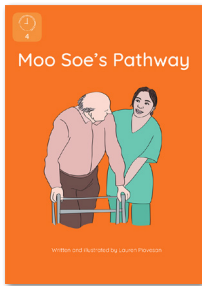

### Milad Goes to the Library

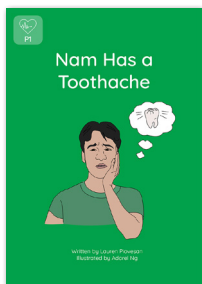

## OUR STORIES



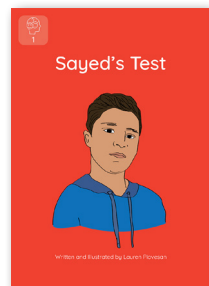
### Moo Soe's Pathway

This short story is based on the education and career pathway of a real English Language student called Sophie. We follow the character, Moo Soe's educational journey, from her career classes in high school, to different further education courses, volunteer positions and jobs.

This story is about a young man who is terrified of going to the dentist. Nam reluctantly makes a dentist appointment for his toothache. This story focuses on form filling, medical history and establishing regular oral hygiene practices.



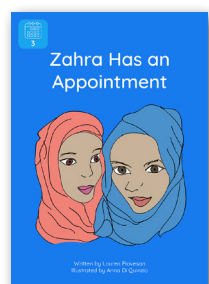
### Sayed's Test
